

Aloe juvenna

al-oh joo-VEN-nuh

Common Names: Tiger Tooth Aloe

Family: Aloeaceae

Origin: Kenya

Growth: Clumping

Light: Full sun

Foot Candles: 250+

Water: When completely dry

Humidity: Not required

Temperature: 18°C+

Soil: Cactus mix

Container: Wide planter with drainage

Nutrients: 10-5-5 Monthly in Spring & Summer

Propagation: Seed or removal of offsets

Interiorscape Use: Desktop, Desert-themed atrium

Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Root rot when overwatered. Leaves may break inside causing a drooping look.

Comments: Very interesting looking Aloe plant.

Perfect for succulent collectors! The leaves feature curved 'toothy' spines. The spines may look sharp but are actually harmless when touched. Very popular in cultivation but extremely rare in its natural habitat.

Toxicity: Safe.
